

BOOKS


Love in the Time of Cholera by Gabriel García Márquez

The epic love triangle between Florentino Ariza and Fermina Daza spans the whole of the characters' lives as well as this entire acclaimed novel. It's this extended narrative that allows Márquez to beautifully convey the wide spectrum of human emotion, ending with that of hope. Famous for popularizing the magical realism literary style, this is one of Márquez's best-known books.




One Hundred Years of Solitude by Gabriel García Márquez

Márquez's magnum opus tells the story of the Buendía family after José Arcadio Buendía founds the town of Macondo. Over the course of a century, the subsequent generations of his family experience natural catastrophe, civil wars, and magical events. Considered one of the most important achievements in the Hispanic literary canon and in world literature, the main theme is the inevitable and inescapable repetition of history.



Fruit of the Drunken Tree by Ingrid Rojas-Contreras

Chula is a seven-year-old girl living in a gated community in Bogotá and her live-in maid, Petrona, is a young woman struggling to provide for her family. In the backdrop of both of their lives is the violence of Pablo Escobar's reign in Colombia, which forces desperate choices and unexpected connections. Loosely based on the life of the author, Ingrid Rojas Contreras, the novel evokes a deep sense of empathy in the heart and mind of the reader.



MOVIES

Embrace of the Serpent (2015)

Ethnographer Theodore Koch-Grunberg is a seriously ill German explorer who, along with his guide and a proud local Shaman, goes looking in the Amazon for a rare healing plant with the hope that it will cure him. 30 years later, another European explorer meets the Shaman and together they retrace the original journey. Inspired by the journals of two of the first explorers of the Colombian Amazon, Embrace of the Serpent reveals much about the effect of colonialism on the Amazon.



Colombia: Wild Magic (2015)

The second-most biodiverse country in the world, Colombia's scenic vistas and native creatures are captured by every incredible shot in this documentary film.



The Colors of the Mountain (2010)

The story of Manuel, a courageous nine-year-old boy who grows up in a small farming community in Colombia's countryside. Manuel dreams of becoming a great goalkeeper, but the civil war that rages in the country changes everything about where he grew up and forces him and his friends to grow up too quickly.

Encanto (2021)

Encanto is an animated Disney film about the magical Madrigal family. Living hidden in the mountains of Colombia, the Encanto gives every family member a unique gift that they use to help the small town they founded. That is, until Mirabel, who, despite not having a gift, commits herself to saving her family and their magic. A fun and colorful film with an unforgettable soundtrack, themes around family dynamics, generational trauma, and the suffering of refugees echoes Colombia's complicated past.



The capital city of Colombia is the ideal place to begin a journey into the country's history, culture, and latest trends. Founded in 1538, Bogotá's historical charm is ever-present in its many colonial-era landmarks, museums, and art galleries, but it's also the epicenter of stylish gastronomic movements, forward fashion, and firstclass nightlife and entertainment.

Since 1953, they've been serving the finest Spanish cuisine and they remain faithful to that legacy today. Any one of the house staples hits the spot, but the paella, which takes 45 minutes to prepare, is our go-to.

Chef Álvaro Clavijo worked in the kitchens of Barcelona, Paris, New York, and Copenhagen before returning to his home city of Bogota and debuting El Chato. He takes the international techniques he learned along the way and infuses them into the best local ingredients, supplied by small producers and so fresh that the menu changes according to what's available. We suggest starting with the granadilla, a local favorite, followed by the suckling pig with cream of black pudding, pea, and habichuelin.

Harry Season 🥖 🖉 🖉

This is the crown jewel and flagship restaurant of Colombia's most famous chef, Harry Sasson. Set in a 1914 red-brick mansion that's both inclusive and upscale, the menu is a blend of Latin American, Asian, and European elements. With one of the largest wine lists in the country, every meal can be perfectly paired.

Prudencia

Enjoy a gastronomic afternoon with seven courses that fuse local ingredients grown on the very property of the restaurant with traditional techniques, such as open-fire cooking and preservation by smoking or fermentation. The menu of Prudencia changes every two weeks and is never repeated, but whatever they're serving for your visit, you're sure to love every bite.

Pedro Mandinga

The first handcraft distillery in Panama, Pedro Mandinga rums are aged between 15 and 21 years, made with an unrefined whole cane sugar called rapadura, and best enjoyed in one of their many rum bars. The local in Bogota is a stylish and cozy, three-story space, with knowledgeable and friendly servers. Stop by on a Sunday when the market outside is buzzing.

Thursday nights are the only nights this exclusive place is open to the public and it often draws a smart and exclusive crowd.

COFFEE SHOPS

Juan Valdez Orígenes

All across the country, you'll find Juan Valdez. This is Colombia's equivalent of Starbucks, only better. Every cup is the product of more than 540,000 coffee-growing families, and their three-floor Orígenes café is a chance to immerse in these origins. Built on one of the most fashionable streets in the city, the first floor pays homage via a two-story vertical garden and chairs that could have come right from a coffee farm. The long wooden tables on the second floor are actually made of coffee plants, while the rooftop is a place to order light meals and cocktails.

ART GALLERIES & MUSEUMS

Gold Museum

The Gold Museum preserves archeological collections of gold, ceramics, lithics, and other materials that give visitors insight into the cultural heritage of the country. The four permanent exhibit halls are the Metalworking room, the People and Gold in Pre-Hispanic Colombia Room, the Cosmology and Symbolism Room, and the Offering Room. Finish the tour in The Exploratory, which promotes reflection on the meaning of Colombia's heritage in an interactive way.



National Museum of Colombia

Created in 1823, this is one of the oldest museums in all of America. Across its seventeen permanent exhibits are more than 2,500 pieces of art, history, archeology, and ethnography that tell the political and cultural history of Colombia. Temporary exhibitions, concerts, conferences, and theatre and dance presentations frequent the National Museum, so there's always something new to experience.

Botero Museum

The originator of "Boterismo", an art style that uses large, exaggerated volume to depict both political criticism and humor, Fernando Botero is considered the most recognized living artist from Latin America. The Botero Museum in Bogota houses 123 Botero pieces and 85 works from international artists, all of which were donated by Botero himself. Called "the greatest gift that a Colombian has ever given to his country", you can't leave Colombia without experiencing Boterismo.

Muzem Emeralds



HIDDEN GEMS

Quinta de Bolívar House Museum

Simón Bolívar was a Venezuelan military and political leader who led Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Panama, and Bolivia to independence from Spain. Known as the Liberator of America, he owned this farm-come-museum for ten years. In 1991, the National Government had the Quinta restored, with all the character it had when Bolivar lived here. Its exhibits now work to build an experience around the figure and legacy of El Libertador.






Flavors of Bogotá

Cartagena de Indias

Altitude: 2 m (6,56 ft)

The colors, flavors, and sounds of Cartagena de Indias are a direct reflection of the lively culture that inhabits this very special part of Colombia. Walk the 16th-century streets of the historic Old Town while snacking on Colombian Caribbean recipes and fresh fruit drinks, spend afternoons waiting for sunset on sandy beaches, and dance your nights away to the Champeta tunes that are carried through the air on beautiful sea breezes.

Celele Restaurant 🥒 🖉

Spanish and European, African, Syrian, and Lebanese arrived in the Colombian Caribbean hundreds of years ago. Their influence mixed with that of the local indigenous people, and the gastronomic result was unique flavors and techniques that, until recently, were in danger of being lost. Determined to save that heritage, Celele was developed by Chefs Jaime Rodríguez Camacho and Sebastián Pinzón Giraldo after years of researching and capturing the authentic gastronomic identity of the Caribbean region. Their small menu encompasses inimitable recipes, our favorite of which is the Beef Tongue in Cartagena sauce.

Alquímico



Museum of Modern Art Cartagena

The MAMC began as a space to house a rescued art collection and has since grown to include more than 300 donated works. Dating to the 17th century, MAMC is located in one of the oldest buildings in the city, and also includes in its programming exhibitions, conferences, and audiovisual events that are open to the public.



HIDDEN GEMS

Vivarium del Caribe

Have fun while you learn about the origins of life at this wildlife theme park. Visitors have the opportunity to feed caimans and tortoises, view different species of fish and reptiles, and walk through a museum that illustrates the biological evolution of crocodiles, dinosaurs, and birds through life-like models and reproductions.

Convento de la Popa

Hovering 148 meters above sea level on the top of Mount la Popa is the convent, cloister, and chapel of Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria de la Popa. This conspicuous religious complex has been part of Cartagena's history since 1607 and, in 1965, it was declared the protector of the city and its surroundings. Apart from its spectacular view high above the city and sea, it contains treasures such as the altar adorned with gold leaf and oil paintings within its walls.



Medellín Museum of Modern Art

The Medellin MAMM has more than 2,000 modern and contemporary works from mostly Colombian and Latin American artists. The works and exhibitions housed here are intended to question traditions and provoke inquiry into the issues of contemporary society in Colombia. Among their most important holdings is the Débora Arango collection, consisting of 246 paintings, watercolors, sketches, and ceramics.



Tairona Gold Museum







Pueblito Chairama

At the end of a magical and historic pathway that was used by the Tayrona indigenous people over 600 years ago lays one of the most important archeological settlements in this region of Colombia: Pueblito. Formerly engulfed by thick jungle and only discovered in 1954, the site once spanned four square kilometers. Some of the networks of terraces, roads, and plazas, still stand to this day, to delight the few who make the venture out there.

Quimbaya Gold Museum

A large collection of pre-Colombian archeological treasures from the Quimbaya and Embera civilizations as well as some of the other tribes that once lived in the area of Armenia. The 390 gold objects, 104 pottery pieces, and 22 stone sculptures, as well as wood, shell, and textile pieces, reveal a little bit about the societies that lived here before European contact. HIDDEN GEMS

Tatamá National Natural Park

Thanks to its remote location, Tatamá remains a hidden gem in the Western Cordillera. Within its 51,900 hectares of tropical and subtropical rainforest, over 500 species of birds, 450 species of orchids, and 700 species of butterflies thrive, unbothered by human presence. This is one of the world's most biodiverse regions, where one can enjoy the sounds of rare songbirds and the sights of endemic and near-endemic species.

HIDDEN GEMS

San Agustín Archeological park

Of course, most visitors to San Agustín come for the archeological park, a UNESCO World Heritage site that contains the largest collection of megalithic sculptures and religious monuments in Latin America as well as the world's largest necropolis. The huge stone figures represent gods and mythical animals in abstract and realist styles, and the enigmatic North Andean culture that made these between the 1st and 8th century is still being explored, with much more for archeologists to reveal.

Bosque De Las Estatuas

Along a 600-meter shaded circuit trail, amongst native plants and flowers, discover thirty-nine statues from the Agustínian ancient culture. These tombstones were recovered from looted sites such as El Satán, El Purutal, La Estrella, and Las Mesitas and relocated to the forest for their preservation.

La Chaquira

A thirty-minute walk along farm roads and past expansive coffee plantations takes you to the small archeological site known as La Chaquira. This is the only site in San Agustín where you'll find carved figures and, like many of the sites in the region, there's no consensus on what these figures mean or what they represent. This outing makes for a lovely afternoon exploring the many carvings while overlooking the Magdalena river gorge and the waterfalls pouring down the steep slopes.

Altitude: 233 m (764 ft)

La Macarena is the gateway to Caño Cristales, a park known for its mileslong, multicolored river. Besides this being one of the most beautiful natural sights in the world, the park houses lagoons and thick forest where a variety of endemic species of birds and other wildlife make their home.

Within approximately 650 hectares, the Macarena Botanical Garden has more than 4% of all of Colombia's plant biodiversity. There are more than 1,200 species of plants and trees, 250 species of birds, and 70 species of fish within its boundaries, where you can hike, go wildlife viewing, or learn about their conservation efforts.
